<u>TV/Monitor</u> <u>Headrest Mount</u>

Fitting Instructions

Tools required:

Phillips screwdriver

The set comprises:

- Headrest Fixing Bracket
- TV Connecting Plate and Fixing Screws

Fitting the TV Connecting Plate

 The VESA Standard Connecting Plate has 75mm and 100mm holes that fit most flat screen TV's from 14" to 27". (fig.1) Fix the plate to the rear of the TV using the screws provided. (fig.2)




Fitting the Headrest Bracket

2. Lift the headrest up to reveal the bars. Undo the thumb screw on one clamp end and fit it over the headrest bar. (fig.3) Repeat for the other side, then tighten them both up tight. (fig.4) Tighten up the centre thumb screw to lock it in place. (fig.5) Loosely tighten up the thumb screw on the connecting arm before fitting the TV. (fig.6)



Fitting the TV

3. Hold the TV in place and tighten the thumb screw. (fig.7) You can now adjust the angles by loosening the two thumb screws holding the arm and the TV, make the adjustment and tighten them up tight. (fig.8) The TV can be rotated so that it sits level.
