

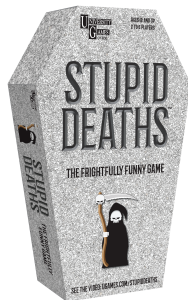

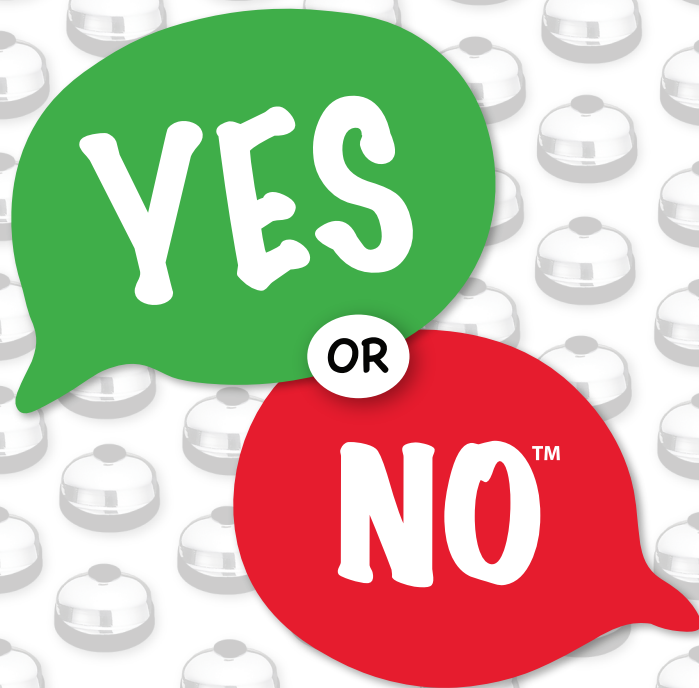

INSTRUCTIONS

Contents:

- 100 Yes or No Cards
- Bell

Object of the Game:

Be the first player to collect 10 Yes or No Cards by either getting other players to say “Yes” or “No” or by avoiding saying “Yes” or “No” on their turn.

Set-Up:

1. Place the Bell so that it is in the middle of all of the players.
2. Shuffle the Yes or No Cards and place them face down next to the Bell.

How to Play:

1. The last player to have said “Yes” or “No” in conversation goes first by turning over the top Card in the deck. This player is the Reader.
2. After reading the instructions on the top of the Card, the Reader turns to the player indicated on the Card and begins to read the questions aloud, one at a time.
Note: The real skill in playing this game successfully is interpreting the questions in the manner most likely to catch an opponent off guard. Players must not add or omit anything from the Card, but the use of pace and intonation can be a good strategy.

3. If the Reader hears that player say “Yes” or “No” during any part of the questioning, the Reader rings the Bell immediately. The Reader keeps that Card and adds it to his/her pile. Play continues clockwise with the next player becoming the Reader.
4. If the Reader does not hear that player say “Yes” or “No” by the end of the questioning, that Card is discarded and play continues clockwise with the next player becoming the Reader.
5. Play continues in this fashion with one player acting as the Reader and another player answering questions from a Card.

Winning the Game:

The game ends when one player successfully collects 10 Yes or No Cards. That player is the winner!

Remember:

The Reader must ring the bell when an opponent says “Yes” or “No” in order to collect that Card. Readers may also ring the Bell if their opponent hesitates for too long, nods or shakes his/her head in a “Yes” or “No” fashion, s/he refuses or cannot answer a question or if s/he repeats an answer more than twice per Card (Example: saying “I don’t know” three times for one Card).
